Design: Descriptive Research Method: Participants in the study were 200 women who infected with HIV and received service at The Infectious Gynecology disease and Sexual Transmitted Disease Unit Siriraj hospital. Data was collected from August 2009 to February 2011 by using the questionnaire which divided into 3 parts: 1. a questionnaire of personal data, 2. a questionnaire measure of relations in the family, 3. a questionnaire measure of reliability and power within-outside their. Data analysis was performed by using descriptive statistics, namely the frequency percent average, standard deviation and statistical analysis: Pearson, s Product Moment Correlation Coefficient , Chi - square Main finding : This study found that the relationship in family influences disclosure results of blood that women infected HIV women with statistical significant level of 0.05 and predicting the factors relating disclosure results of blood are relationship in family, and disease stage. Conclusion and recommendations: Factor that influence blood results disclosure is relationship in the family and the predicting power factors associated blood results disclosure are relationship in the family and disease stage. Therefore The result of this study should be applied for patient counseling to increase blood result disclosure to better quality of patient, s life.
