Common competency for ASEAN Doctors (derived from 10 medical schools) and proposed definition (from Dr.Coralie, Dr.Cherdsak and Dr.Suwannee 28032018)

- **1. Clinical competency**: Ability to approach, gather clinical information, diagnose, investigate, provide treatment, rehabilitate the patients in clinical settings, health promotion, and disease prevention
 - 1. Medical knowledge: preclinical knowledge, clinical knowledge, patient safety
 - 2. Clinical skills: history taking, physical examination, diagnosis, procedural skills, health promotion and disease prevention
- **2. Communication and interpersonal skills**: Ability to communicate, and collaborate with others
 - 1. Teaching skills: small group, large group, patient education
 - 2. Communication skills: written, verbal communication, media, presentation
 - 3. Cultural competency: understanding and living with people from other cultures

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- **3. Professional manner and ethics**: Ability to work in professional manner under ethical and legal standards
 - 1. Professional ethics: ethical principles and practice
 - 2. Legal standards: professional laws and regulations
 - 3. Social accountability
- 4. Self awareness and professional development through lifelong learning:
 Ability to regularly reflect and update oneself by utilizing a variety of avenues for continuing personal and professional growth
- **5. Research skills**: Ability to systematically search and appraise literature and utilize new knowledge in patient care
 - 1. Evidence- based practice
 - 2. Critical appraisal
 - 3. Medical information management

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- 6. Systems-based approach to healthcare: Ability to identify and integrate available health systems in providing patient and population care in various health care delivery settings including times of disaster
- 7. Leadership and management of healthcare team: Ability to work collaboratively and effectively as a leader or follower in a healthcare team, including interprofessional collaboration
