- Clinical competency: Ability to approach, gather clinical information, diagnose, investigate, provide treatment, rehabilitate the patients in clinical settings, promote health, and prevent disease
 - 1.1 Medical knowledge: preclinical knowledge, clinical knowledge, patient safety
 - 1.2 Clinical skills: history taking, physical examination, diagnosis, procedural skills, health promotion and disease prevention
 - 2. **Communication and interpersonal skills**: Ability to communicate, and collaborate with others
 - 2.1 Teaching skills: small group, large group, patient education
 - 2.2 Communication skills: written, verbal communication, media, presentation
 - 2.3 Cultural competency: understanding and living with people from other cultures
 - 3. **Professional manner and ethics**: Ability to work in a professional manner guided by ethical and legal standards
 - 3.1 Professional ethics: ethical principles and practice
 - 3.2 Legal standards: professional laws and regulations
