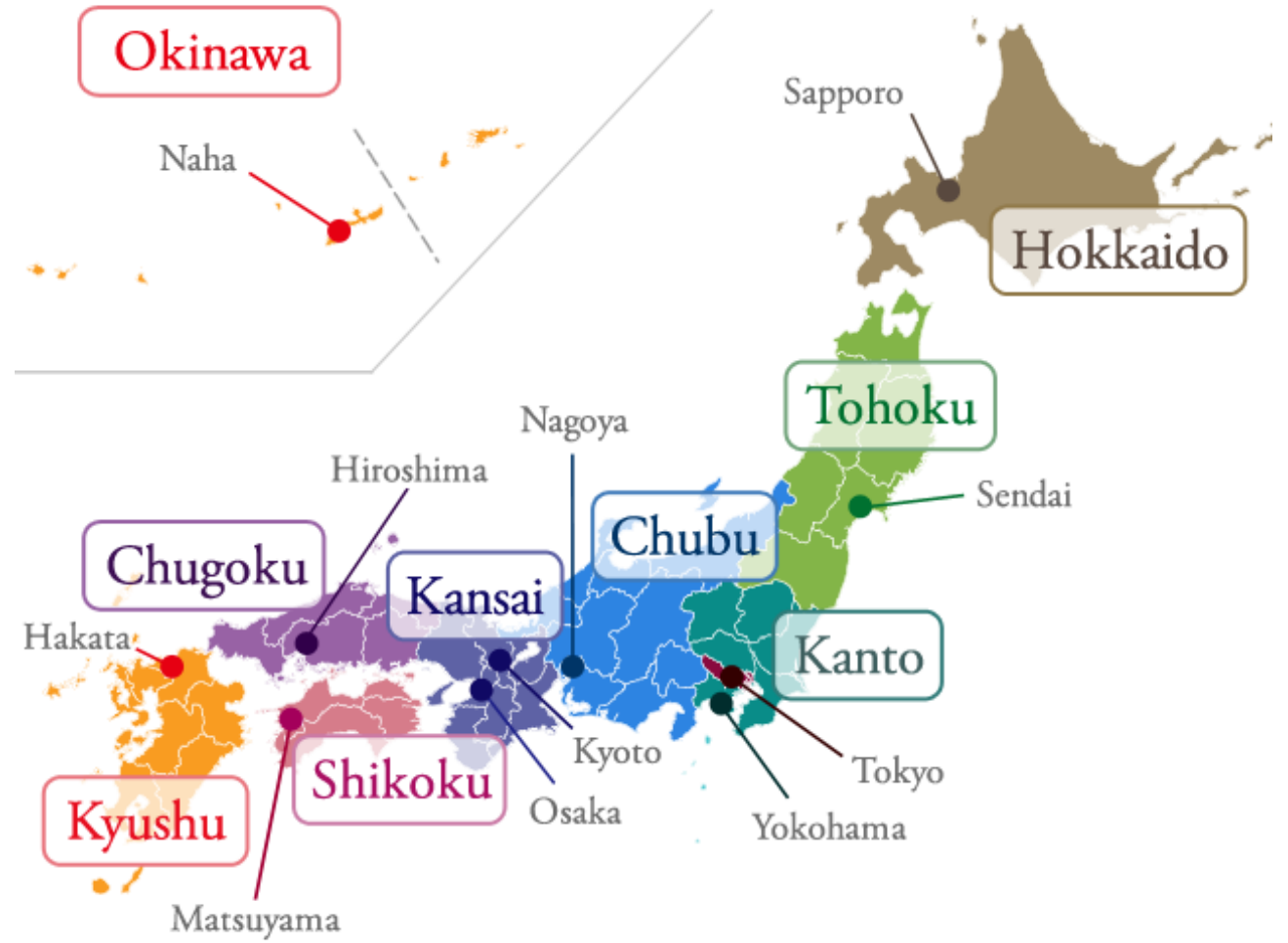

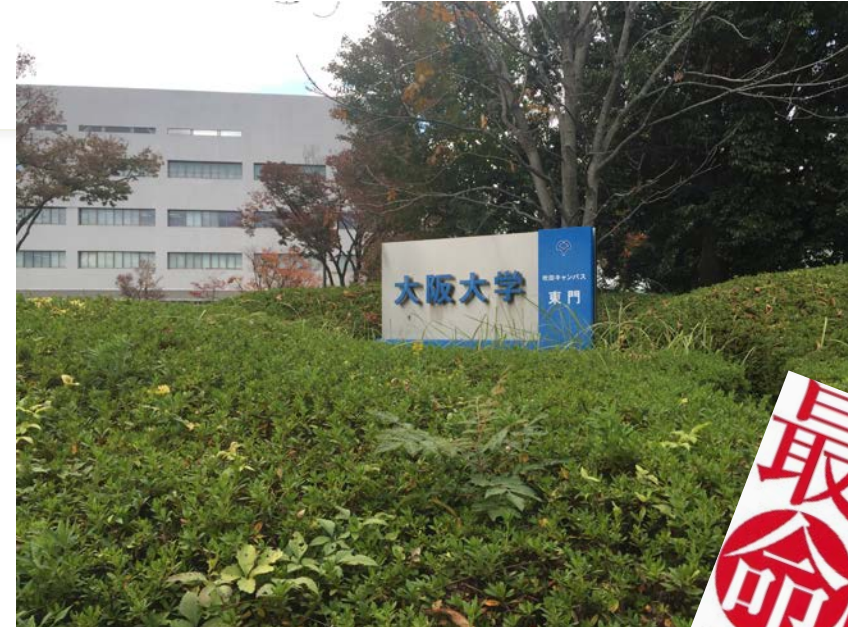

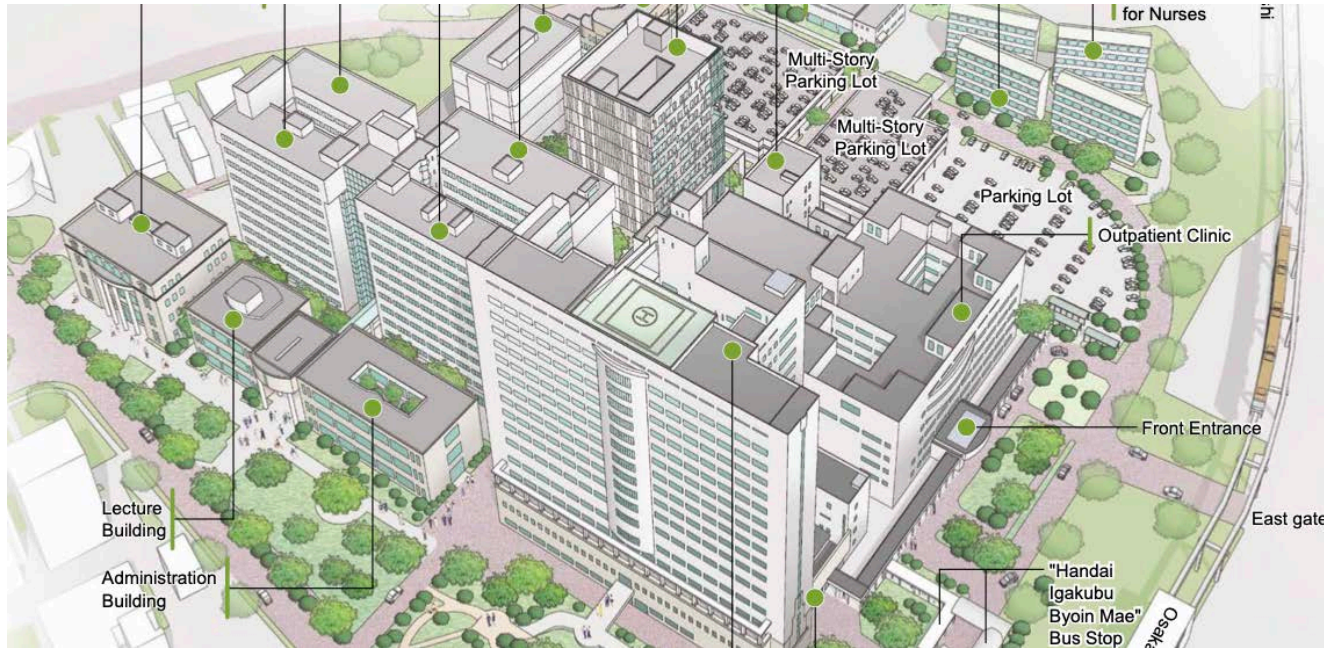
Why Osaka?

To study about the management of patients with short bowel syndrome in outpatient service using home TPN

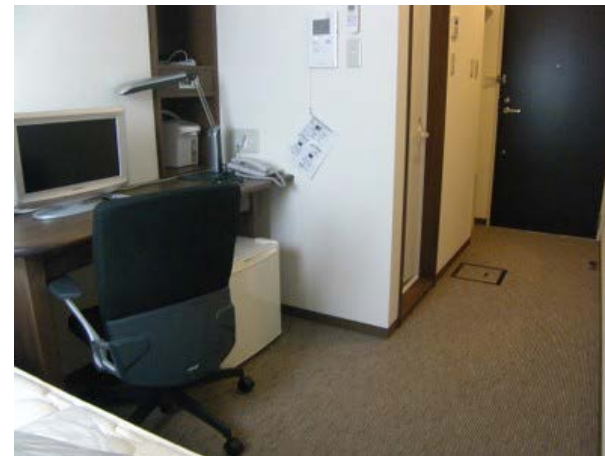
